Public Comments: Karen Anderson asked if the County Solicitor had provided any recommendations on how to address the findings in the RKL report. She stated that based on the report the money that went missing in 2018 was not the same money that was later found and also pointed out the COBRA payments deficiencies outlined in the report. Ms. Anderson asked if action would be taken regarding the missing money as well as evaluating the 2019 COBRA payments for accuracy.

Mary Colledge asked if the County bank statements would show if the IRS tax payments had been made.

Frank Campbell stated that the Tri-County Regional Planning Commission, in conjunction with the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission, are compiling a list of historical structures in flood plain or flood prone areas.

Dave Magee commented on the news article he read regarding SEDA-COG entering into a gas agreement in Centre County. He questioned if Perry County, due to its involvement with SEDA-COG, was receiving any benefits from the gas agreement.

Approval of Minutes: Commissioner Rudy made a motion to approve the minutes of September 23, 2019. Commissioner Naylor seconded the motion. All agreed. Motion carried.
