The Perry County Commissioners intend to submit an application on or about August 31, 2021, to the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED) under the Federal HOME Program for approximately \$500,000 for a County-wide Owner-Occupied Housing Rehabilitation Program. Under the Housing Rehabilitation Program, income-eligible homeowners may receive up to \$65,000.00 for housing rehabilitation expenses.

A Public Hearing will be held on Monday, July 19, at 9:30 A.M. The meeting will be held in the Commissioners' Meeting Room located in the Veterans Memorial Building at 25 West Main Street, New Bloomfield, PA 17068. There is also the option to join the meeting virtually and those details are posted on the County website(www.perryco.org) prior to the meeting.

All interested agencies, groups, and individuals will have an opportunity to discuss the program and provide input at this time. From the date of the Public Hearing, there will be a 10-day period for public questions and comments relating to this application or previous use of HOME funds until End of Business on July 29, 2021.

No displacement is anticipated, and every effort will be made to avoid or minimize displacement and relocation. Should displacement be required, the applicant is responsible for replacing all low- and moderate-income (LMI) housing units that are demolished or converted.

One hundred percent of HOME funds will be used to benefit low- and moderate-income populations.

Perry County will not discriminate in access to, participation in, or treatment or employment in its federally funded programs or services.

Technical assistance will be provided upon request to any groups or persons, especially LMI persons or their representatives, when developing proposals intending to use HOME funds. The County Commissioners will strive to make all programs and activities accessible to the learning, mobility, vision, hearing, and language-impaired persons.
