Commissioner Allen opened the meeting at 10:00 a.m. on October 4, 2021 with the Pledge to the Flag and a moment of silence in remembrance of Bob Gross, former 911 Dispatcher for the County. The meeting was conducted in person and via WebEx telephone/video conference in the Commissioners' Meeting Room. The meeting was recorded by the County.

Announcements/Updates: Commissioner Allen recognized Erin Comp, the 2021 4-H Extension Summer Assistant and former Perry County 4-H member, for being the recipient of the Allen L. and Richard H. Baker 4-H Scholarship. Ms. Comp Erin Comp was awarded \$1,250.00 and plans to major in animal science with a business minor in agribusiness at Penn State University.

Commissioner Eby reminded everyone that ARPA public hearings were taking place that day and space was still available for anyone interested in requesting funding. He said to contact the Chief Clerk to make an appointment.

Public Comments: Ed Albright thanked the Commissioners for attending the ribbon cutting ceremony at the water authority.

Wayne Leshar asked for a broadband update. He also questioned if the County was limited to Upward Broadband and Zito. Mr. Leshar stated that Zito's service is horrible and asked if there has been any research into the broadband companies. He raised a concern that money could potentially be invested into a vendor with poor customer service.

Approval of Minutes: Commissioner Eby made a motion to approve the minutes from the September 27, 2021 Commissioners' Meeting. Commissioner Watson seconded the motion. All agreed. Motion carried.

Meeting Business: Commissioner Watson made a motion to approve the property lease agreement with Harold Engle at a cost of \$700/month. Commissioner Eby seconded the motion. All agreed. Motion carried.

Commissioner Eby made a motion to approve the MH/IDD contracts for Intellectual & Developmental Disabilities and Mental Health for fiscal year 2021/22 in the total amount of \$901,146 and commented that the decrease in transportation was due to telehealth and social rehab facilities being closed (attached). Commissioner Watson seconded the motion. All agreed. Motion carried.

Commissioner Watson made a motion to approve the 2021/2022 Cumberland-Perry Drug and Alcohol Commission contracts. Commissioner Eby seconded the motion. All agreed. Motion carried.
