Commissioner Allen opened the meeting at 10:00 a.m. on July 25, 2022 with the Pledge to the Flag and a moment of silence. The meeting was conducted in person and via WebEx telephone/video conference in the Commissioners' Conference Room. The meeting was recorded by the County.

Announcements/Updates: None

Public Comments: Nancy Pote, Auditor, stated that tomorrow night at 7:00 p.m. at the Perry County Courthouse, a vote would occur to fill the vacant Auditor position. She said there are two candidates, Mel Heffley and Donna McMillen.

Approval of Minutes: Commissioner Watson made a motion to approve the minutes from the July 18, 2022 Commissioners' Meeting. Commissioner Eby seconded the motion. All agreed. Motion carried.

Commissioner Watson made a motion to reaffirm the actions taken at the July 11, 2022 meeting held at the Tuscarora Township Building. Commissioner Eby seconded the motion. All agreed. Motion carried.

Meeting Business: Commissioner Eby made a motion to approve the 2022/2023 Cumberland-Perry Drug & Alcohol Commission contracts for inpatient and outpatient providers (attached). Commissioner Watson seconded the motion. All agreed. Motion carried.

Commissioner Eby made a motion to approve the agreement with Grudi Associates for telephone assessment & feasibility consulting in the amount of \$2,000. He said this agreement was for the County telephone system in the various County buildings. Commissioner Watson seconded the motion. All agreed. Motion carried.

Commissioner Watson made a motion to approve the PREA auditing contract for the Perry County Prison in the amount of \$3,750. Commissioner Eby seconded the motion and noted that this occurs every three years. All agreed. Motion carried.

Solicitor's Report: Solicitor Bunt commented that last week communication had been received confirming the amount of the opioid settlement. He stated that based on the notification, the County will receive \$1,606,857.69, broken down into 18 payments. He said that Commissioner Eby would be spearheading the project.

Public Comments: Taira Little, Director of the Perry County Chamber of Commerce, stated that Cocolamus Creek Disposal was no longer providing very many recycling bags to County residents. She questioned if the County had taken any action or was looking into a recycling initiative.

Comments from the Press: Andrea Kitner asked for more information regarding the opioid settlement. She also questioned who Commissioner Eby had spoken to regarding County recycling.

Commissioner Watson made a motion to adjourn at 10:16 a.m. Commissioner Eby seconded the motion. All agreed. Motion carried.
