Commissioner Allen opened the meeting at 10:00 a.m. on November 1, 2021 with the Pledge to the Flag and a moment of silence. The meeting was conducted in person and via WebEx telephone/video conference in the Commissioners' Meeting Room. The meeting was recorded by the County.

**Public Comments:** Alane Balchunas stated that she had read in the newspaper about the increase in COVID deaths in the County. She commented that she missed the weekly COVID updates by Rich Fultz and hoped that the updates would be added back into the Commissioners' meeting agendas in the future or via the Perry County Times.

Malinda Anderson, New Bloomfield Borough President, stated that a large amount of debris is still on the property from the fire at the Cumberland Perry housing units located on West Main Street. She said rodents have been spotted in the area and was looking for assistance to get the property cleaned up. She commented that the building manager had been spoken to several times, but no action has been taken to date and residents are complaining to the borough.

Wayne Lesher said if the County was looking into cleaning up buildings, they should look into the Freysinger building. He asked for a broadband update and questioned if the project was bid more than once. Mr. Lesher asked why the broadband RFP was not sent out again for additional proposals. He said there may be additional vendors to consider. He commented that he is looking to move out of the County due to the technological issues he has trying to run his business.
