Commissioner Campbell opened the meeting at 10:00 a.m. on September 21, 2026 with the Pledge to the Flag and a moment of silence. The meeting was recorded by the County.

Approval of Minutes: Commissioner Lyons made a motion to approve the minutes of the September 14, 2026 meeting. Commissioner Watson seconded the motion. All agreed. Motion carried unanimously.

Approval of the Warrant List(s): Commissioner Watson made a motion to approve the warrant lists totaling \$555,517.80. Commissioner Lyons seconded the motion. All agreed. Motion carried unanimously.

Meeting Business: Commissioner Campbell presented members of the DAR (Daughters of the American Revolution) a Constitution Week Proclamation. He thanked the organization for their efforts preserving history and for their work during the America 250 celebrations. He noted that it was the 239th anniversary of the creation of the Constitution.

Commissioner Lyons made a motion to accept the lowest electric price received as of today, per the recommendation of Provident Energy Consulting. Commissioner Watson seconded the motion. Commissioner Campbell noted that Provident was the County's energy consortium and said the pricing would be affirmed at the next meeting. All agreed. Motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Watson made a motion to approve the quote from Clear Ballot for server switch at a cost of \$475. Commissioner Lyons seconded the motion. Sarah Geesaman, Election Director, said the server needed to be updated. All agreed. Motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Lyons made a motion to approve the 2025/2026 Cumberland-Perry MH/IDD contracts (listed below). Commissioner Watson seconded the motion. Commissioner Campbell noted that additional details of the contracts were on the agenda. All agreed. Motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Lyons made a motion to approve the 2026/2027 Cumberland-Perry MH/IDD contracts (listed below). Commissioner Watson seconded the motion. Commissioner Campbell again said additional information was on the agenda. All agreed. Motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Watson made a motion to approve Amendment No. 1 to the Emergency Food Assistance Program

Agreement. Commissioner Lyons seconded the motion. Commissioner Campbell stated that this amendment was with the Department of Agriculture and the County partners with Neighbor Helping Neighbor Food Bank on this program. All agreed. Motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Lyons made a motion to approve the service agreement with Johnson Controls for fire system tests/inspections at a cost of \$5,296.66. Commissioner Watson seconded the motion. Commissioner Campbell noted this was for the Courthouse and Scott Stump, Maintenance Director, stated that this service was for testing the fire alarm sprinkler heads and control panels in the Courthouse. All agreed. Motion carried unanimously.

Employee Status: Commissioner Watson made a motion to approve the appointment of Adana Rojas to the position of Part-Time Correctional Officer at the Perry County Prison effective September 23, 2026 at an hourly rate of \$24.43. Commissioner Lyons seconded the motion. All agreed. Motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Lyons made a motion to approve the termination of Dillon Blais, Full-Time Deputy Sheriff effective September 14, 2026. Commissioner Watson seconded the motion. All agreed. Motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Watson made a motion to approve the appointment of Donald J. McKee to the position of Full-Time Deputy Sheriff in the Sheriff's Office effective September 28, 2026 at hourly rate of \$21.36. Commissioner Lyons seconded the motion. All agreed. Motion carried unanimously.
